

Unit 7: Nonfiction Writing: Specialist Book (4 weeks)

To view the Grade 1 Nonfiction Specialist Book Unit developed by the Literacy Design Team go to eChalk, My Groups, select Grade 1 ELA Resources

- Analyze student writing to assess whole class, small group and individualized needs.
- Have guided writing groups as a way to differentiate instruction.
- This unit includes information, fluency and technology learning outcomes that naturally lend themselves to a collaboration between classroom and library.
- Teachers may have students publish writing using word processing tools such as Word or other online publishing tools.
- Have different types of paper available so students have paper choice for independent writing.
- Interactive writing and shared writing are essential daily balanced literacy components that allow teachers to demonstrate strategies the various strategies students are expected to use in their own writing. While interactive writing is often used to demonstrate conventions (e.g., spacing between words, punctuation, using word wall, stretching out words) shared writing is often used to compose several class texts that model the genre being studied. These class texts are often referred to during follow up minilessons to demonstrate a teaching point.
